As we drive through the neighborhoods around the city, it's impossible not to notice the heavy equipment working on the streets and the barricades that have been erected that keep us from our usual pathways. The once rather direct route home from work has become very convoluted. Here's some information from the Civic Connection newsletter, May 2012:

Public Works Coordinates Infrastructure Improvements throughout the City. Public and private utilities are investing millions of dollars to replace and improve infrastructure systems in our City. The Department of Public Works coordinates these utility projects along with the City's internal Capital Improvement Projects. This coordination is required to avoid conflicts in scheduling, partner on street restoration and to have the work accomplished as guickly and efficiently as possible, minimizing disruption to citizens and businesses. Coordination challenges include old, unmapped pipes and systems as well as parking and traffic control. But the effort pays off; when the projects are complete, residents and businesses will enjoy new, more reliable infrastructure as well as restored roads, driveways and

sidewalks that accompany the completion of these projects.

Below are some of the projects currently in progress:

- Virginia Natural Gas (VNG) Pipeline Replacement Projects. VNG has been improving their infrastructure in Norfolk for the past several years. Over the next four years, VNG will continue their progress by replacing at least 50% of their gas pipelines throughout the city. These improvements will insure safety, reliability, and protect pipes from corrosion. As part of the work, older cast iron and steel gas mains will be replaced with state of the art plastic and steel pipes. Completion date: Summer/Fall 2012. The projects are financed by fees paid by VNG customers and federal grants.
- HRSD Sanitary Sewer Force Main Replacement Projects. HRSD is undertaking major projects to replace and relocate the following: three miles of sewer line located in the Young Terrace, Ghent and West Ghent areas, one and a half miles of sewer line in the Riverview and Colonial Place areas and 4,000 linear feet of gravity sanitary sewer located in the Riverview area. Completion date: Fall 2012. The projects are financed by fees paid by HRSD customers.
- Dominion Virginia Power (DVP) Network Upgrade Project (Downtown). Over the last five years, DVP has upgraded its downtown underground network system to prepare for light rail. An upcoming project will finalize the upgrades and improve reliability and redundancy to downtown developments. Completion date: Winter 2012/2013. The project is financed by fees paid by Dominion Power customers.
