## Wards Corner Civic League Membership Meeting 5-21-2018

The meeting opened at 6:32PM with a moment of silence in honor of Ray Duron. Ray was the former Treasurer of the Wards Corner Civic League Board, and supporter of both the Boy Scouts and Bishop Sullivan Catholic High School. The Pledge of Allegiance was then said. Officer Old followed with a short report: a burglary in the 500 block of Timothy, which was closed by arrest. He also noted thieves targeting personalized license plates and recommended as a safety precaution, using tamper proof license plate screws.

Our speaker was Joe Dillard with HRT. He discussed the approximately 100-million-dollar budget for HRT and how they not only spend it, but how it is raised. Norfolk carries the lion's share of the contributions. He discussed the lack of, but need for, regional cooperation to create a cohesive transit system through all the Hampton Roads Cities. A complete system is attractive to large businesses when they are looking for cities to move into. He also talked about two distinctions for HRT: HRT is the largest bus system in Virginia, and HRT is also the only transit system in Virginia with light rail. Mr. Dillard discussed the Core 20 plan, which included taking 20 heavily used routes and dedicating resources to them to better link our metro, malls, schools and other business areas. He fielded questions about Park and Ride and Light Rail plans to continue to Naval Base Norfolk.

Next to speak was Jo Anna Tremper, President of the Wards Corner Optimist Club. She petitioned for volunteers to help in their fundraising efforts. The Optimist Club, established in 1987, has tried to support the youth in our and many other areas by providing scholarships. The scholarships are awarded as prizes in Spoken Word and Writing contests in conjunction with our local school system. They also try to promote safety, nonviolence, and internet safety. For more information, contact the WCCL Board and we can put you in touch with a member of the Club.

WCCL President Scott Gurlinger updated us on the North Shore Playground improvements. The plants for the playground area have been purchased, a time needs to be picked, and volunteers need to be secured to help get the plants in the ground. He pointed out that the new Wards Corner Adopt-a-Spot is the large open field next to the Norfolk Wellness and Fitness Center. Out next cleanup effort will be sometime between July and September.

Councilman Martin Thomas updated us on a few things. This year's budget includes \$900,000 to purchase more blighted properties around the Wards Corner commercial area and to have them torn down to make space. Talk has been leaning towards Soccer and Lacrosse fields going in that space. Martin also mentioned that SL Nusbaum will be taking over the construction of the retail and restaurant areas proposed around the new outlet mall.

The meeting adjourned at 7:51PM.

We also look forward to our next neighborhood cookout, scheduled for:


Saturday, September 8, 12:00 – 3:00 pm
