Wards Corner Civic League Membership Meeting 1-23-2020

Vice President Chris DePalma opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Officer Old reported that property crime is down for the month. There were a couple violent crimes, one solved by arrest, the other still being investigated. There was a stolen vehicle also being investigated and a stolen cell phone reported as well.

Vice Mayor Martin Thomas advised on a couple of issues. February 13, 2020 at the Wards Corner Task Force meeting, HRT will be speaking. Asked about Norfolk Airport expansion, right now there is no clearance for moving forward. Regarding the Casino, the agreement made with the Tribe is that they can buy the land as part of the City of Norfolk not a separate nation, and they are allowed to build and operate a commercial gambling casino under the approval of the State that allows commercial gambling in the Commonwealth of VA.

A representative from the Census Recruiting office visited and talked about the real opportunity for employment. They expect to need over 2600 employees to go door to door to help gather census information. You must be 18yrs of age and successfully pass a background check.

Betty Herman with the Friends of the Norfolk Fltness and Wellness Center also spoke. She clarified that there is no plan to close the NFWC pool in the near future. There is an upcoming inspection. She mentioned that the Friends

of the NFWC help to raise money as a non-profit that is used to provide items for the Center that they require.

Mr. Ted Drake came and spoke for Delegate Robert Bloxom (VA-100). He reported that Delegate Bloxom is now on the Agriculture, Appropriations as well as Privileges and Election committees. He also noted that during the session, Over 900 budget amendments were reviewed, and over 5000 new bills were passed.

There was a brief update that more trees, hopefully edibles, will be provided for the North Shore Playground upgrades to help even further with the lowland flooding that occurs.




