After several years of waiting and anticipation, the redesign process for the Fitness & Wellness Center is finally underway. This is the first important step in the longer process of constructing a revitalized and/or replacement facility.

The city has hosted an initial public workshop and now a public survey is available. I encourage all of you to please take this survey and to actively share it with all of your neighbors as well. My personal goal for this facility is for it to be the most inclusive facility in the city, hopefully, the region, and offer a diverse set of amenities and services that meet the diverse needs of Norfolk residents. That diverse and inclusive output requires diverse and inclusive input, meaning we need as many residents as possible to respond to this survey. Only then can we truly say that we have heard the needs of city residents and have created a plan that best meets those needs. (See later in this newsletter for the survey information.)

It is worth reiterating where we are at in this redesign process, which is at the beginning. Regardless of what you might hear from neighbors or city staff, no design decisions have been made yet and no budget limitations exist yet. This initial public input period and survey start from a blank slate on what the current NFWC property can be transformed into for the future.


In April of 2020, the pool was closed due to structural concerns related to the dome that spans and covers the pool. Get real-time flooding updates with this new partnership

Real-time flooding updates just got easier thanks to Norfolk's partnership with RISE, climate tech FloodMapp and Waze! FloodMapp is testing the integration of their flood forecast technology with Waze's navigation app here in Norfolk.

What's this mean for Waze users? Drivers receive pop-up icons and audio alerts to warn them of flooded streets along their route – to help avoid property and life-threatening hazards. Drivers can also confirm flooding in the app with a "thumbs up" to help validate FloodMapp's technology and improve the accuracy of future Waze alerts.
