Thank you to everyone who attended our virtual meeting in April with featured guest Mayor Alexander. He shared lots of valuable information and it was helpful to hear his perspective on how things are in Norfolk now, and what he envisions for the future. I want to thank the Mayor for speaking with us, and also for his behind-the-scenes work to get MetroNet to provide residential fiber service in Norfolk. I personally cannot wait for fiber internet to get here!

While construction is underway, MetroNet is currently signing up residents ahead of time. (Maybe if enough residents in Wards Corner preregister, they will "light us up" first?) I am told that as an incentive for signing up early, MetroNet is giving customers a free month of service. This concludes the initial public input portion of the design process. My understanding is that we now wait for the design firm to analyze the input and come back with some initial concepts.

To summarize my own comments from the meeting, in the questions being asked by staff and survey, I see a current focus on features but would prefer to see a focus on outcomes. I believe our desired outcome is a measurable change in resident well being - physical, mental, emotional, educational, etc. I believe it's more important to talk about services first, features and amenities second. 

Granby Street Bridge Traffic Pattern Changes

The City of Norfolk's Department of Transit is a year into the Granby Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project in which the bridge is undergoing extensive repairs to extend its useable life. Both the bridge deck and the support structures are being repaired to address current corrosion and deterioration issues as well as improve the bridge's condition.

Beginning Monday, March 28, the southbound lanes on Granby Street Bridge will close to accommodate rehabilitation work on that portion of the bridge. Northbound traffic over the Granby Street Bridge will shift to the far two right northbound lanes. The inside left northbound lane on the bridge will then be closed and switched to carry all southbound traffic. Further, the inside left turn lane on Willow Wood Drive will close to accommodate the single southbound lane crossing over the Granby Street Bridge.

This traffic pattern will be in place through late August. Four portable message signs warning of the upcoming traffic pattern changes were installed two weeks prior to the southbound bridge closure. The contractor will coordinate with Norfolk police for assistance on site during this traffic pattern shift.

The meeting was opened by President Scott Guirlinger.

Officer Fritz Trojahn, Community Resource Officer, NPD, provided an update on criminal activity in the Wards Corner area and answered questions.

Guest Speaker, Mayor Kenny Alexander, City of Norfolk, provided city updates and answered questions.

- City budget FY 2023
- \$1.7B with no new taxes or fees pending passing of state budget.
- 5% general wage increase for employees.
- Minimum wage increases for permanent employees \$18 per hour.
- Part time- seasonal employees increase to \$15 per hour.
- City is waving some fees on high personal property tax bills, saving Norfolk tax payers \$5B.
- \$23M for infrastructure improvements, mainly technology.
- Increasing NPS contribution by 7.5%- \$376M for 2023 and \$700M over 3-5 years for upgrades and replacements.
- American Rescue Funds
- Federal- \$1.9T
- State- \$3.8B
- City of Norfolk- \$154M
- Spent or pledged \$6M for broadband, \$800,000 for eviction mitigation and \$13M for non-profits affected by COVID.
- Other grants or passthroughs from Federal and State funds.


