## GREATER WARDS CORNER TASK FORCE MEETING

February 8, 2024, Notes by Karen Hayes of Suburban Acres Civic League

The meeting was hosted by Norfolk Vice Mayor Martin Thomas, City Council Member Andria McClellan, and City staff.

Norfolk 2050 – The Norfolk Department of City Planning has started the process of developing a new Comprehensive Plan. The Comprehensive Plan will create a framework for how Norfolk will grow and evolve over the next 25 years. Public input is important to this process and will be through a series of meetings and on-line surveys. Citizens can sign up for updates and the current survey at www.nfk2050.com.

Norfolk Fitness and Wellness Center - Department of Parks and Recreation says the City has selected three design/build companies, who are developing their final concept plans, due in March. The City will award the contract to one of these firms, likely in Summer 2024. The City will solicit more public input for the final design in 2024. Construction is now anticipated to start in Spring 2025. The task force asked why this process is taking so long with the dates slipping at every meeting of the task force. Director of Public Works, Richard Broad, said there is guite a bit of due diligence required of the City to ensure their contractor selection process would stand up to court challenge. The move of Primeplus Senior Center to the Titustown Recreation Center is under design, but getting the project on budget is a challenge. Bob Batcher, director of Primeplus, said he is concerned that the new facility will not have the space the organization needs for its expanding programs.

# GREATER WARDS CORNER TASK FORCE MEETING (CONTINUED)

Shopping Center has been sold to a local developer. The new owner is talking with the City and Norfolk Southern and is considering retail uses such as food and beverage or mixed use that would include apartments.

The lease on the former Form Fresh et Words Corner.

The lease on the former Farm Fresh at Wards Corner expired in December 2023. The real estate firm that owns the property may sell it, but is also considering another grocery store, mixed use, or residential development. The redevelopment of the old Kroger/Workforce property is still moving forward with a possible redesign of the proposal that was previously submitted to the City. The former DePaul Hospital has been sold to the non-profit Next Steps to Success, who plan to redevelop the site as a youth outreach and development program. Rezoning for this use will be required; surrounding civic leagues are in support. Wards Corner Fencing – The City has reinstalled the sections of black fence that were removed by mistake, but they do not plan to reinstall the sections in the narrow medians along the Granby Street turn lanes. Public Works Director Richard Broad says the costs of fixing the fencing do not justify the use of taxpayer funds since the original intent of the fencing was for beautification of Wards Corner, not safety. The City is also reassessing the fencing in downtown in areas that are routinely hit. The costs include \$75 per linear foot for the fence, \$2800 for two days of traffic control, and \$75 an hour for the Norfolk Police Department. Mr. Broad said that often the fencing is damaged again as soon as they repair it.
